

HURRICANE SEASON JUNE 2017-TO PRESENT ON ANGUILLA

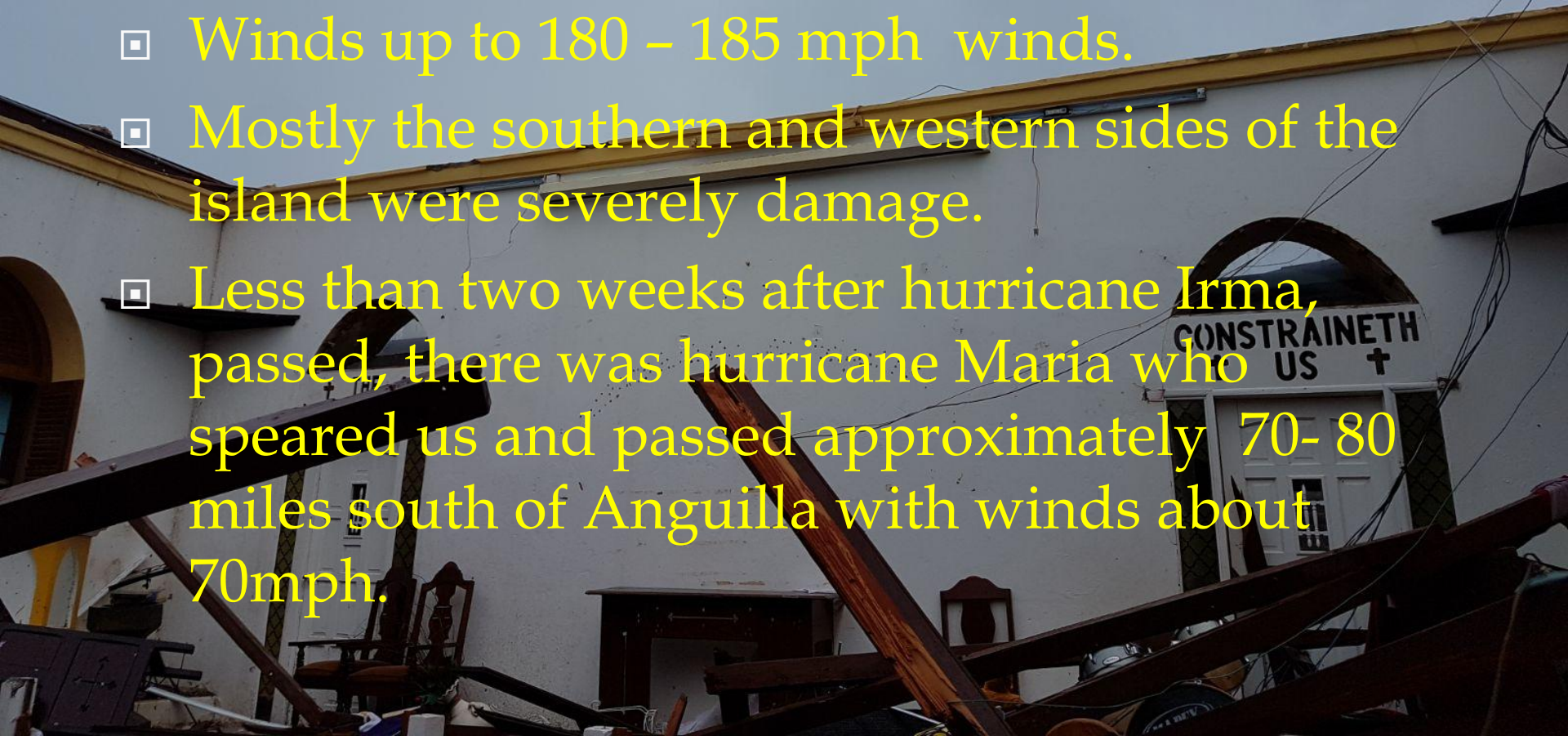
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Brief Summary

- ▣ On the 6th September 2017 Anguilla was hit by Hurricane Irma.
- ▣ Winds up to 180 - 185 mph winds.
- ▣ Mostly the southern and western sides of the island were severely damage.
- ▣ Less than two weeks after hurricane Irma, passed, there was hurricane Maria who speared us and passed approximately 70- 80 miles south of Anguilla with winds about 70mph.



Rainfall

- ▣ Rainfall measured on between the 05th and 06th September 2017 was 297.8 mm or 11.72 inches but no flooding was reported.
- ▣ Our rain gauge was severely damage after Hurricane Irma and no rainfall has been recorded since.
