


Lightning Density + Population Distribution Where do Latinos Live and Work?

- Latinos are more exposed due to the jobs they tend to have
- Top three occupations with the most Hispanic/Latino workforce are outdoors
- Farming, Fishing, Forestry (43.4% Latino)
- Grounds Maintenance (36.7% Latino)
- Construction & Extraction (32.3% Latino)

- The National Lightning Safety Council (NLSC) was established to promote lightning safety education and awareness.






